

# 2027 Application Guidelines for the Special Entrance Examination

— Graduate School of Science and Technology —

Degree Programs in Pure and Applied Sciences

(Master's Program in Materials Innovation / Doctoral Program in Materials Innovation)

JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

(UNIVERSITY RECOMMENDATION)

## Important Notice

This special entrance examination is used to select students recommended by the university as MEXT scholarship student. Materials Innovation plans to apply for the JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM this fall. Please be notified that if the Materials Innovation is not selected for the MEXT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM, successful applicants to this entrance examination will be admitted to our university as privately financed students.

These guidelines are for the entrance examination for the MEXT scholarship program.

From among those who pass the entrance examination, candidates for recommendation to MEXT will be selected.

\* MEXT will announce the guidelines for 2027 in December 2026. Should there be any changes to the application requirements, the University of Tsukuba will announce them to each applicant.

## 1. Qualifications and Conditions

University of Tsukuba and MEXT accept applications from international students of graduate school level who are newly coming to Japan or those already staying in Japan and satisfy the following qualifications and conditions. Applicants must commit to enrolling in the University of Tsukuba if they are accepted.

### (1) Academic Performance

Applicants must have demonstrated excellent academic achievement with a Grade Point Average of 2.30 (out of 3.00) or above at the previous school, and the evaluation on the same level is expected during the scholarship payment period.

### (2) Nationality

Applicants must be citizens of a country that has diplomatic relations with Japan. In principle, an applicant who has Japanese citizenship at the time of application will not be eligible. However, persons with dual citizenship who hold Japanese citizenship and whose place of residence at the time of application is outside of Japan are eligible to apply as long as they choose citizenship of the foreign country and renounce their Japanese citizenship by the date of their arrival in Japan.

(3) Age

Applicants must be born on or after April 2, 1992. Exceptions are limited to cases in which MEXT deems that the applicant could not apply within the eligible age limit due to the situation or circumstances in the applicant's country (military service obligation, loss of educational opportunities due to disturbances of war, etc.) Personal circumstances (financial situation, family circumstances, state of health, circumstances related to applicant's university or place of employment, etc.) will not be considered exceptions. However, applicants from the Young Leaders Program can only apply for the doctoral program within five years after graduating from the same program.

(4) Academic Background

Applicants must meet one of the following requirements to be accepted in the Master's Program/Doctoral Program in Materials Innovation from April 2027.

**[Master's Program]**

- 1) Individuals who have completed 16 years of education in a foreign country and have earned a bachelor's degree, or who are expected to graduate and receive their bachelor's degree by March 2027.
- 2) Individuals who are 22 years of age or older as of March 2027, and whose qualification is recognized as equivalent to a bachelor's degree as the result of the eligibility screening conducted by the University of Tsukuba.

**[Doctoral Program]**

- 1) Individuals who have a master's degree or who are expected to receive one by March 2027.
- 2) Individuals who have a specialized degree or are expected to receive one by March 2027.
- 3) Individuals who have a master's degree or a specialized degree awarded by a university outside Japan as of March 2027.
- 4) Individuals who are 24 years of age or older as of March 2027, and whose qualification is recognized as equivalent to a master's degree or a specialized degree as the result of the eligibility screening conducted by the University of Tsukuba.

Note: As a general rule, persons who have completed a doctoral course may not apply unless they seek to obtain a degree.

(5) Field of Study and Number of Students to be Accepted

Master's Program in Materials Innovation: A few

Doctoral Program in Materials Innovation: A few

Recipients of the MEXT scholarship will be selected from those who pass the entrance examination of the MEXT scholarship program for 2027 degree students.

## (6) Language Proficiency

Applicants must satisfy one of the following qualifications in Japanese or English:

### ○ Japanese

- 1) Have passed N2 or higher level of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) by the time of enrollment in the regular course
- 2) Have completed a curriculum that meets the admission requirements for a master's course/doctoral course in Japan by using Japanese as the main language
- 3) Judged by the University of Tsukuba to have Japanese language ability equivalent to or better than N2 of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT)

### ○ English

- 1) Have B2 or higher level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) at the time of enrollment in the regular course
- 2) Have completed a curriculum that meets the admission requirements for a master's course/doctoral course in Japan by using English as the main language
- 3) Judged by the University of Tsukuba to have English language ability equivalent to or better than B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR)

## (7) Health

Applicants must be physically and mentally fit enough to pursue study at a university.

## (8) Security Export Control

The University of Tsukuba has established the University of Tsukuba Rules on Security Export Control in accordance with the Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act and conducts strict examinations for acceptance of international students. International applicants who fall under any of the conditions set out in said regulations may be unable to enter their desired course or program.

**Prior to application, contact your desired faculty advisor and ask them to implement export control procedures.**

## 2. Selection and Notification

### (1) Selection

#### **Application**

**Deadline: September 3, 2026 5:00 p.m. (JST)**

Submit all application documents shown in No. A-1 to No. A-7 electronically to the following email address:

We request the successful applicants to send the original documents after the examination.  
Please prepare them in advance.



### **Examination**

#### **October 8 and October 13–15, 2026**

Recipients will be selected based on screening of the application documents and oral examination.

- 1) The oral examination will be conducted on October 8 and from October 13 to October 15, 2026, via Zoom etc.
- 2) The oral examination (total 200 points)  
English ability: 50 points  
Ability to execute research: 150 points
- 3) The schedule for your oral examination will be sent to you by email.
- 4) Each applicant will be asked about their research plans, academic skills and knowledge of specialized fields.



### **Acceptance Announcement**

#### **October 30, 2026**

Successful applicants' examination numbers will be posted under 'Important News' on the top page of the website of the Degree Programs in Pure and Applied Sciences.

### **Notification regarding recommendation for MEXT scholarship**

#### **October 30, 2026**

Successful applicants of the entrance examination will receive an email notification on the announcement day regarding whether they will be recommended for the government scholarship.

**Application for Scholarship**

**Deadline: Early December 2026(TBA)**

Successful applicants selected as a recommended candidate for the MEXT Scholarship are required to submit the scholarship application documents. Details of the application procedure will be sent by email to the relevant individuals.

**\*Official Notification from MEXT**

**Early March 2027**

Recipients will be notified individually via email.



Successful applicant **not selected** as a recommended candidate for the MEXT Scholarship

Successful applicants not selected as a recommended candidate for the MEXT Scholarship can enroll as a privately sponsored student. In that case, they must pay the admission and tuition fee. Please inform us of your decision as to whether you intend to enroll as a privately sponsored student or decline the offer of admission.



**Admission Procedure to Confirm Enrollment**

**Deadline: Early March 2027**

You need to complete the procedure via the website by the deadline. Some are requested to submit additional certificates via postal mail. Please follow the instructions.

Note: Even if you wish to decline admission, you are required to access the admission procedure website and inform us of your withdrawal through the website.

Note: Date of transportation to Japan will be designated by the University of Tsukuba.

A-5	Summary of Research and Future Research Plans	Write it in English by using the designated form.

A-6	<p>Documents to certify language proficiency (Applicants only need to meet either Japanese or English.)</p>	<p>Japanese: <u>Certificate for passing N2 or higher level of JLPT</u></p> <p>English: <u>Score report of language proficiency test that corresponds to B2 or higher level of CEFR</u></p> <p>* Applicants must have obtained a score equivalent to CEFR B2 or higher on a test that assesses all four skills: Listening, Reading, Speaking, and Writing. For TOEIC, applicants must take both the TOEIC Listening &amp; Reading Test and the TOEIC Speaking &amp; Writing Tests, and all four skill scores must be equivalent to CEFR B2 or higher to be eligible.</p> <p>* For tests that provide scores for each skill, all skill scores must be at or above CEFR level B2.</p> <p>* If you have results from two or more proficiency tests, submit only one of them.</p> <p>Note: Applicants who have graduated or will graduate from a university or graduate school where English or Japanese is the main language should submit an official document issued by the university.</p>
A-7	<p>Examination Admission Slip</p>	<p>Use the prescribed form.</p> <p>The size of the photo must be 4.5 x 3.5 cm; taken within the last 6 months; upper body; hat off; front side. Attach it as electronic data.</p> <p>Note: Please do not change the image of the person by editing or processing the image to make the eyes look larger, whitening the skin, or modifying facial features, moles, wrinkles, etc. Such modifications may prevent us from verifying the applicant's identity using the photo on the reference card on the examination day.</p> <p>If any image editing or manipulation is detected, it may be treated as misconduct.</p>
A-8	<p>Letter of Approval for Entrance Exam and Admission (Any format is acceptable)</p>	<p><u>1. Individuals who are currently attending a university or graduate school. *Except for applicants who are expected to complete by the admission.</u></p> <p>Need to submit a letter of approval issued by the head of their university or graduate school (or the head of their department) with their official seal or signature allowing them to take the entrance examination or a letter from the applicant with his/her</p>

		<p>seal or signature stating that he/she will withdraw from the university before enrolment. Any format is acceptable, but the letter must be printed on A4 paper.</p> <p><u>2. Individuals who are currently working for a government agency, school, or company (except for part-time workers)</u></p> <p>Need to submit a letter of approval issued by a superior with their official seal or signature allowing them to take the entrance examination or a letter from the applicant with his/her seal or signature stating that attending the entrance examination will not adversely affect their duties. Any format is acceptable, but the letter must be printed on A4 paper.</p> <p>{Applicants who plan to leave their company to enroll in graduate school may instead submit a self- declaration (with their seal or signature affixed). In this case, the applicants must submit a “Certificate of Resignation” at the time of the enrollment procedure.}</p>

**Note:**

1. If your current name is different from that on the documents you submit (for example, because of marriage), you will be required to submit proof of your name change (e.g., copy of marriage license).
2. All the documents except for specified official documents must be created in A4 size paper (same size as the application form) in Japanese or English.
3. Your application will not be evaluated if the above documents are incomplete or not accurately completed. Applications received after the deadline will not be processed.
4. Before you apply, you have to contact a prospective supervisor (a faculty member from whom you wish to receive academic instruction) and obtain their consent to your application in advance.
5. If any false or forged statements are found in the application documents, or if there is any obvious examination misconduct, the acceptance or admission may be revoked. In serious cases, the matter may be reported to the police or subject to legal action.

**3. Examination Fee**

The examination fee for this special entrance examination will be waived.

**4. Scholarship Information**

- Although these application guidelines include information regarding October admission, the Program in Materials Innovation accepts applications only for enrollment in April.
- Applicants who pass the entrance examination and are selected for scholarship recommendation will be provided with detailed information and instructions regarding the necessary documentation for the scholarship application later.
